26TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE KLA EPOPEE CELEBRATED AT “ADEM JASHARI” BARRACKS



On the occasion of the 26th anniversary of the KLA Epopee, a significant commemoration was held at the “Adem Jashari” Barracks. State leaders, dignitaries, and citizens gathered to honor the memory of the legendary commander of the Kosovo Liberation Army (KLA), Adem Jashari, and the Jashari family.

The ceremony commenced with a drill parade by the KSF (Kosovo Security Force) squares. Notable attendees included President Vjosa Osmani, Prime Minister Albin Kurti, the Speaker of the Assembly Glauk Konjufca, Minister of Defense Ejup Maqedonci, and the KSF Commander, Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari. Also present were ministers, deputy ministers, senior officials from the Ministry of Defense, KSF generals, and other local and international authorities. Brigadier General Ilir Qeriqi, Chief of Staff of the KSF, reported to the President Osmani on the KSF’s readiness to commemorate the KLA Epopee. President Osmani, accompanied by Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari, inspected the KSF formations. The state and national anthems were performed by the KSF musical troupe, followed by a solemn wreath-laying ceremony at the KLA obelisk.

President Osmani delivered a poignant speech, highlighting the superhuman sacrifice of the Jashari family during the heroic battle in Prekaz. She stated, “Whenever March 5, 6, and 7 arrive, our memories return to the pride and glory of those first 26 years. The Prekaz epopee, with its irreplaceable sacrifice, altered the course of our struggle for freedom and independence.”

Prime Minister Albin Kurti echoed the significance of the KLA Epopée, emphasizing the historical context. He said: “We know our history. We value our history because it is dense in names and deeds. We honor our history because we recognize it in the entirety of society, wherever we go in the world with our history in our hearts, within every threshold in our families here and in our exile wherever it is. We are many because we carry famous names in our minds”. Speaking on behalf of the Jashari Family, Lulzim Jashari, the son of the Legendary KLA Commander Adem Jashari, who in his speech emphasized among other things: “Your weapons, and never forget this, are the continuation of the most peaceful weapons in Balkans and beyond. The weapons of the ancestors were never stained with the blood of civilians but only targeted the uniform of the invaders. The weapon of the Albanian, as the peaceful weapon in the Balkans, was fired only in the name of the defense of the state and the nation, that is, only in the name of freedom, I repeat only in the name of freedom. We must preserve this great tradition and pass it on to the generations.” The legacy of Adem Jashari and the KLA continues to inspire generations, reminding us of the unwavering commitment to freedom and independence.



MINISTER MAQEDONCI AND GENERAL JASHARI PAY TRIBUTE TO THE JASHARI FAMILY

ITALY UNWAVERINGLY SUPPORTS KOSOVO'S EU AND NATO MEMBERSHIP

Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, with an official ceremony, accompanied by the ceremonial platoon of the KSF, welcomed his counterpart from Italy, Minister Guido Crosetto to the meeting.

Also, in this meeting was the Deputy Minister of Defense, Shemsi Sylja, the director of the Directorate for Intelligence and Security, Major General Gëzim Hazrolli, as well as officials and senior officers of the Ministry of Defense and the KSF.

In this friendly meeting, they talked about the security situation in the country, as well as ways to expand cooperation in the field of education and military training, as well as in the field of the defense industry.

On this occasion, Minister Maqedonci asked for Italy's support in the processes for Kosovo's EU and NATO membership, where Minister Crosetto confirmed Italy's unsparing support. Both agreed that the Integration of the Balkans into the EU



and NATO would create lasting stability and peace.

Minister Maqedonci thanked his counterpart for the support that Italy has offered to

Kosovo, especially in the field of security and defense, being the country with the largest



participation of troops within the KFOR mission. Likewise, the Italian delegation was informed about the support that Kosovo is offering to Ukraine, through the provision of training and the donation of tactical vehicles and ammunition that are expected to be sent soon.

CROATIA ASSURES ONGOING SUPPORT FOR SOVEREIGNTY AND NATO MEMBERSHIP AND THE EC



As part of diplomatic engagements with partner countries, Minister of Defense Ejup Maqedonci hosted a visit by Croatia's Minister of Defense, Ivan Anusic. The official reception ceremony, accompanied by the ceremonial platoon of the Kosovo Security Force (KSF), took place at the Ministry of Defense facility. During this meeting, the two defense ministers and their respective delegations held the bilateral meeting.

The KSF commander, Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari, the Deputy Minister of Defense, Shemsi, also participated in this meeting. Sylja, the Chief of Defense of Croatia, Tihomir Kundid, director of the Directorate for Intelligence and Security, Major General Gëzim Hazrolli, Chief of Staff of the KSF, Brigadier General Ilir Qeriqi, Ambassador of Croatia in Kosovo, Danijela Barisic, as well as other senior officials and military men from both countries.

In the meeting held, it was discussed about

the security situation in the country and the region, the service of Croatian troops within KFOR, the defense capacities of Kosovo and the military directions, where cooperation between Kosovo and Croatia can be increased.

Minister Maqedonci emphasized that Kosovo and Croatia share a long common past as friends, allies and partners, the relations between which countries will continue to develop in accordance with our goals for peace, stability and security.

Minister Maqedonci thanked his counterpart for the support so far in the field of defense, education and training of KSF soldiers, while he asked for support for

Kosovo's membership in the Adriatic Charter. On the other hand, the Croatian Minister of Defense, Anusic, emphasized that Kosovo will always have Croatia's support in the fight against terrorism, the preservation of the country's sovereignty, and also on the way to membership in NATO and the European Council.



MINISTER OF DEFENSE EJUP MAQEDONCI PARTICIPATED IN THE 20TH UKRAINE DEFENSE CONTACT GROUP MEETING



Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci participated in the 20th meeting of the Contact Group for the Defense of Ukraine in Ramstein, Germany, where he emphasized that the Republic of Kosovo remains steadfast in supporting the fair struggle of the people of Ukraine and will support it until the final victory. Minister Maqedonci informed the ministers and representatives of over 50 countries of the Contact Group about the

support provided by the KSF for the training of Ukrainian troops within the framework of Operation Interflex in the United Kingdom, as well as the training for demining for Ukrainian troops, which is being carried out in cooperation with EUCOM, in Kosovo. Also, the minister informed those present about the first package of military support that will be sent to Ukraine during the next week, which consists of dozens of tactical trucks, tactical vehicles and military armored vehicles. In his speech, Minister Maqedonci announced the coordination and preparation of the second military support package, consisting of thousands of mortar shells, which will soon be sent to Ukraine, in order to support Ukrainian military units to increase their firepower indirectly.



KOSOVO HAS BEEN ACCEPTED AS AN ASSOCIATE MEMBER STATE OF THE NATO PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY

On the 25th anniversary of the commencement of NATO attacks, Defense Minister Ejup Macedonia announced this milestone. He stated that with the admission of their parliamentary observer as an associate member state in NATO, Kosovo is beginning a new chapter. The word of Minister Maqedonci regarding this important event for our country:

“Today, on the 25th anniversary of the start of NATO’s attacks, we are marking a new chapter with the news that the Permanent Executive Commission of the NATO Parliamentary Assembly has decided that Kosovo, from a parliamentary observer, will be accepted as an associate member state. March 24, 1999, marked a new momentum for Kosovo and its struggle for freedom and an independent state, while today with this decision of NATO we are one step closer to fulfilling our goal as an inviolable state and for a stable Balkans. The intervention of NATO on March 24, 1999, could not but happen as it was the only form that could end the ethnic cleansing of Kosovo, stop the killings of children, women, men and the elderly, systematic rapes, persecutions, burnings and violent expulsions and with focus, therefore, March 24 is not only aligned with the people of Kosovo but also aligned with the right side of human history as an action in support of the values of Western civilization, peace, freedom, and democracy. It is regrettable that our northern neighbor, even 25 years after the end of the war, does not apologize and does not feel remorse for the genocide committed in Kosovo. State archives have never been opened, while the executors of the crimes of the Serbian state continue to walk free. While today we remember NATO’s bombings as the most righteous action of this powerful military alliance, the Serbian state continues to blame NATO and justify Milosevic’s genocidal actions. This speaks a lot about the same mentality that continues to exist among Serbia’s rulers. We cannot bring back to life the victims, the killed of the massacres, but we are forever grateful to the members of the Kosovo Liberation Army, the martyrs, and NATO that make it possible for us today to live in the independent state of the Republic of Kosovo.”

THE MINISTER MAQEDONCI HOSTED THE HEAD OF THE DEPARTMENT FOR FOREIGN RELATIONS OF THE MINISTRY OF DEFENSE OF TÜRKIYE, BRIGADIER GENERAL ÖMER NAFİZ GÜLMEZOĞLU



The Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, along with the KSF Chief of Staff, Brigadier General Ilir Qeriqi, and other distinguished MoD/KSF officials and officers, hosted a meeting with the Head of Foreign Relations for the Turkish General Staff, Brigadier General Ömer Nafiz Gülmezoglu. The meeting was also attended by esteemed officials and senior officers from Türkiye. Minister Maqedonci thanked General Gulmezoglu for the unsparing support of the Republic of Türkiye through all phases of Kosovo's state building, especially in the field of defense and security, and expressed the strong will for the further continuation of this close cooperation between both countries. For his part, General Gulmezoglu thanked Minister Maqedonci for the friendly reception and noted that Türkiye will always support Kosovo in achieving its strategic goals. Also, General Gulmezoglu affirmed that the Republic of Türkiye is interested and engaged in maintaining peace and stability in Kosovo and in the region and that this is best proven by the presence of Turkish troops within KFOR.

KSF Conducted Military Dialogue Meeting with Turkish Armed Forces



Following the meeting at the Ministry of Defense of the RKS of the head of the Department for Foreign Relations within the General Staff (GS) of the Armed Forces of Türkiye Brigadier General Ömer Nafiz Gülmezoglu with the Minister of Defense Mr. Ejup Maqedonci, the working teams from KSFGS and AF of Türkiye under the leadership of the Chief of Staff of the KSFGS, Brigadier General Ilir Qeriqi, continued the meeting in the premises of KSFGS.

In this meeting, the cooperation so far between the KSF and the Turkish Armed Forces was discussed, with special emphasis on M2M military cooperation. General Qeriqi thanks General

Gulmezoglu for the assistance of the Republic of Türkiye and the Turkish Armed Forces in the development and professionalization of the KSF.

The meeting for the military dialogue between the KSF and the AF of Türkiye was planned within the framework of the Bilateral Plan and the purpose was to control the implementation of the bilateral plan for 2024 and define the way forward in the cooperation report for 2025.

INAUGURATION OF THE STATE TRAINING CENTER FOR CYBER SECURITY

The inauguration ceremony for the State Training Center for Cyber Security was held at the ‘Adem Jashari’ KSF Barracks in Prishtina. Attended prime Minister of Republic of Kosovo Albin Kurti, the Minister of Defense, Ejup, Maqedonci participated in this inauguration, KSF commander, Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari, Deputy Minister of Defense, Shemsi Sylaj, director of NALT, Brigadier General Ralf Peter Hammerstein, the ambassador of the United Kingdom in Kosovo, Jonathan Hargreaves, as well as officials and senior officers of the MoD/KSF as well as international partner countries.



In his speech, addressed to the attendees of this ceremony, Prime Minister Kurti emphasized that he is pleased to mark an important moment in the path that Kosovo is following towards a safer cyber space, adding that the inauguration of this Center represents a commitment, dedication and significant achievements in this regard.

“The past year has been a year of progress for many of our initiatives and policies in the field of cyber security. The trainings that will be held in this Center will address the essential objectives for the development of human capacities for cyber security and the creation of collective awareness of cyber risks”, said Prime Minister Kurti.

Meanwhile, the Minister Maqedonci announced that the State Training Center for Cyber Security will offer training in order to raise awareness of risks in the field of cyber security, will improve professional skills and help raise the cyber security levels of institutions. government, operators of essential services and providers of digital services, to achieve the capacities for the protection of critical infrastructure in the country. Likewise, the Minister Maqedonci thanked Prime Minister Kurti, the Embassy of the United Kingdom and the Embassy of the USA, who enabled the realization of this project of high state interest.

The curriculum for the State Training Center for Cyber Security, which constitutes an essential element in the implementation of the national Cyber Security Strategy, has been designed with the support of the Embassy of the United Kingdom and implemented by the Geneva Center for Governance of the Security Sector (DCAF) with local and international experts.

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KSF ARSENAL EXPANDED WITH ADDITION OF MULTIFUNCTIONAL MILITARY TRUCKS MADE IN GERMANY

Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, together with Prime Minister Albin Kurti and the commander of the Kosovo Security Force, Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari, closely saw the fleet of multifunctional military trucks. RheinMetall MAN HX2, 8X8 which have been added to the army's arsenal. Out of a total of 15 trucks, 10 were purchased with the state budget, while five were donated. Minister Maqedonci emphasized that these trucks are among the most modern, multi-functional, designed for logistical and tactical operations. "The new features of this pure military truck are very impressive. Thanks to various assistance systems, HX2 offers soldiers and the civilian environment greater safety in the daily use of vehicles and guarantees significantly more protection in the cabin", said Minister Maqedonci, adding that fleet management in these trucks also becomes more simple and more efficient, while the overall configuration enables the transport of ammunition in difficult terrain. The Kosovo Security Force is increasingly equipped to guarantee the fulfillment of its constitutional mission.

DEFENSE MINISTER EJUP MAQEDONCI ATTENDED REOPENING CEREMONY OF KUCOVO MILITARY AIR BASE IN ALBANIA



Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, described this as a historical event that will give another geostrategic character to Albania and the Balkans in general. "This base, which will serve as a tactical and operational air base, constitutes the biggest investment of Albania and the NATO alliance, as the collective defense asset in the most threatened security decade. Since the Kosovo Security Force, in accordance with the Comprehensive Transition Plan, will also increase its air capacities, we hope that Albania will continue building a modern air fleet", emphasized Minister Maqedonci. Further, he added

that the Albanian nation is always on the right side of history, therefore this base, as well as all military capacities, will only be in the function of peace. Through the Kucova airbase, the security situation in the Balkans will now be seen from a different view, certainly more consolidated than ever the cooperation between NATO member states and our neighbors who want stability.

PRESIDENT OSMANI CELEBRATED INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY WITH THE WOMEN AND GIRLS OF THE MINISTRY OF DEFENSE AND THE KSF



In honor of International Women's Day, March 8, in the premises of the “Adem Jashari” Barracks in Pristina, a festive ceremony was held, where women and military girls of the KSF, veterans of the KLA and KPC were present, as well as Ministry of Defense officials. Attended Minister Maqedonci, deputy minister Shemsi Sylja, the deputy commander of the KSF, Major General Enver Cikaqi, as well as officers and senior officials of the MoD and the KSF. During this training that took place at the International Training Center for Search and Rescue in Pomezatin, the units of the Civil Defense Regiment, the Hazardous Materials Company exchanged experiences with the members of the Army of the Republic of North Macedonia on the capacities, the way of operating in the field as well as the use of specialized equipment . Also, during this exercise, our members and the members of

the Republic of North Macedonia were tested in simulations organized by American instructors. The simulations were varied and complex, covering all fields, chemical, biological and radiological.

This training was a very good opportunity for our members to exchange different experiences, operations, real interventions and many years of experience on the part of the participating members and instructors.

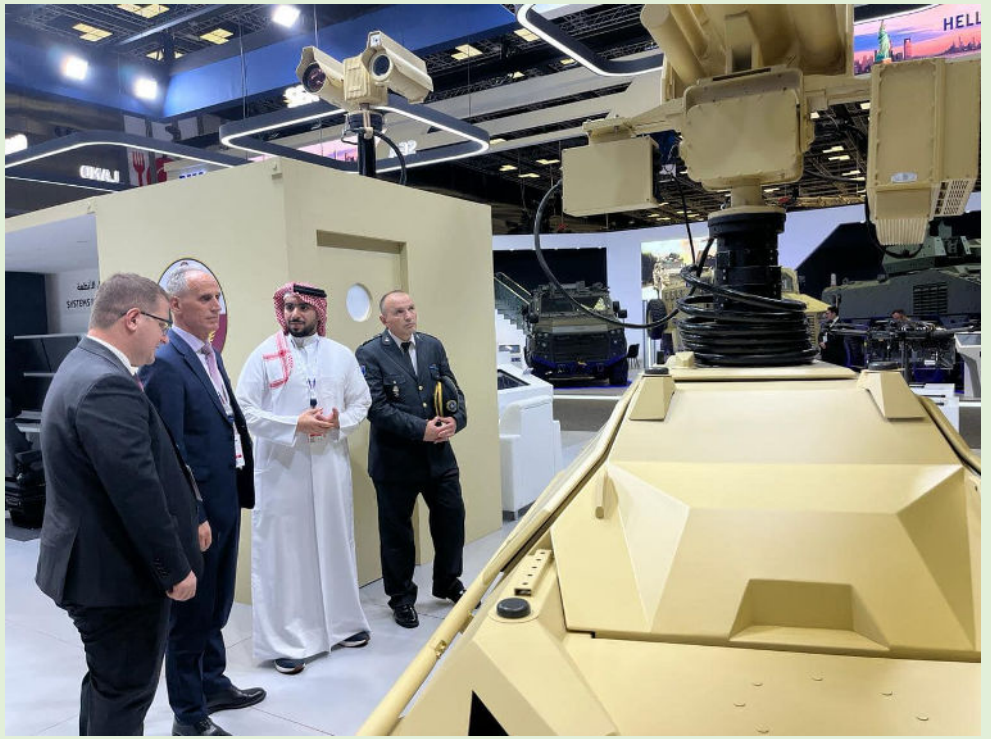
On this occasion, Deputy Minister Sylja and his delegation visited the fair, accompanied by our ambassador to Qatar, Fuad Morina.

KSF COMMANDER VISITED IOWA - GENERAL JASHARI AND GENERAL OSBORN DISCUSSED JOINT ACTIVITIES IN STATE PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM



At the invitation of the commander of the Iowa National Guard, Major General Stephen Osborn, the KSF commander, Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari and his delegation have been on an official visit to Iowa, USA.

During the meeting, General Jashari thanked Mr. Gregg for the continuous support that the state of Iowa is giving to Kosovo in general and the KSF in particular. COMKSF had the opportunity to inform him about the achievements of the KSF, and the way forward in the development of new capacities. The deputy governor expressed his satisfaction with the level of cooperation and the achievements, and expressed his willingness to continue deepening the cooperation at the highest possible level.

The KSF delegation also visited the Kosovo Consulate in Iowa, where they were received by the First Secretary of the Consulate,

Mr. Fatmir Rrahmanaj . He presented the work of the consulate and their engagement in coordinating and synchronizing joint activities in the field of defense and diplomacy.
