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KOSOVO CELEBRATES ITS 16th ANNIVERSARY OF INDEPENDENCE



The 16th anniversary of the declaration of Kosovo's independence was marked through numerous events. The state leaders have thanked the allies and international partners for their contribution to the liberation and independence of Kosovo.

On this day, Minister Maqedonci and General Jashari, together with state leaders and senior staff of the Ministry of Defense and the KSF, paid tribute and laid wreaths at the “Adem Jashari” Memorial Complex in Prekaz, where freedom and independence of our state originates from.

THE MINISTER OF DEFENSE OF THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY, BORIS PISTORIUS, VISITED THE MINISTRY OF DEFENSE



Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci hosted the Minister of Defense of the Federal Republic of Germany, Boris Pistorius, on an official visit, accompanied by members of the Bundestag and the ambassador of Germany in Kosovo, Jörn Rohde.

The two defense ministers held a meeting with the deputies of the Bundestag and the members of parliament of the Republic of Kosovo from the Committee on Security and Defense Affairs, where they discussed current security topics in the country and the region.

Minister Maqedonci and his German counterpart visited the units of the National Guard of the KSF, specifically the SAR International Training Center Kosovo, in Pomozatin, where they were received by the commander of the

National Guard of KSF, Brigadier General Naim Haziri and the director of SARITC, John Doone, who informed them about the history, mission, organizational structure, scope, achievements so far, personnel, equipment, infrastructure, training facilities, current activities, challenges and projects for the future.

In his speech to the staff of the KSF National Guard and other attendees, the German Minister of Defense, Boris Pistorius expressed his gratitude for the reception and emphasized that he is pleasantly surprised with the impressive developments within the KSF, especially with the capacities of the SARITC. At the bilateral meeting presented, also Dep/Minister Sylja, the commander of the KSF, lieutenant general Bashkim Jashari, the director of the NATO Advisory and Liaison Team (NALT), brigadier general Ralph Hammerstein, as well as senior officials of the Ministry of Defense and the KSF.



FINLAND WILL CONTINUE TO STRONGLY SUPPORT KOSOVO'S INTEGRATION INTO THE EUROPEAN UNION AND NATO MEMBERSHIP



At the invitation of the Ministry of Defense of the Republic of Finland, the Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, has stayed in Finland, where he was received in a meeting by the Minister of Defense, Antti Hakkanen. In this meeting, the Minister Maqedonci informed his Finnish counterpart about the latest security developments in the Western Balkans region, with special emphasis on security in the Republic of Kosovo and the threats our country is facing. Also, he informed him about the development of defense capacities and the need for support from partners at this time when democracy and global security are being undermined by the hegemonic approach of autocratic stakeholders.

From his part, Minister Hakkanen emphasized that Finland will continue to strongly support Kosovo's integration into the

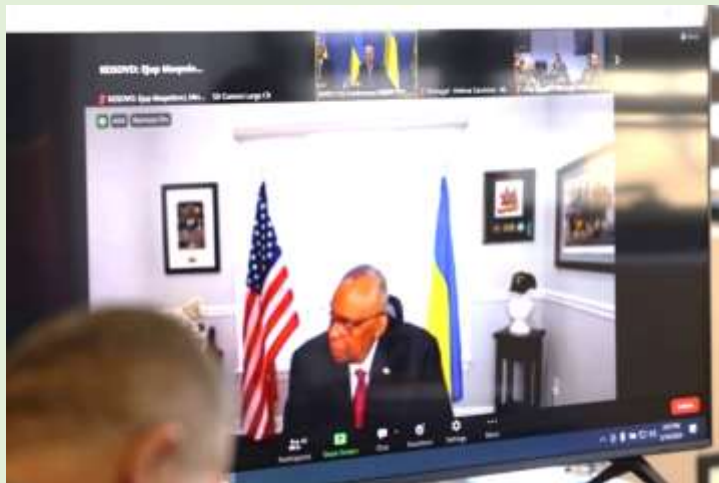
European Union and NATO membership, as well as expressed his willingness and that of the Ministry of Defense of Finland to deepen cooperation with the Republic of Kosovo, in the field of defense and security. During the meeting, they also discussed the need to continue supporting the righteous struggle of the Ukrainian people, as well as the opportunities for cooperation between our countries in the field of the defense industry. During the visit to the Ministry of Defense of Finland, the Minister Maqedonci held meetings with the Directors of the Directorate of Defense Policies and Material Resources.

Also, minister Maqedonci and his delegation of the MoD visited the Center of Excellence of NATO and the EU for hybrid threats (Hybrid CeO), where with the director of this Center they discussed the possibilities of mutual cooperation, in order to deal with hybrid threats.

towards a professional, multi-ethnic force, interoperable with NATO and ready to develop the territory defense mission.

IOWA NATIONAL GUARD COMMANDER MAJOR GENERAL STEPHEN OSBORN VISITS KSF



The Commander of the Kosovo Security Force (KSF), Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari, in February hosted the Commander of the IOWA National Guard, Major General Stephen Osborn. During the meeting, it was discussed about the cooperation between KSF and IOWA so far, and the way forward. As part of the visit, the generals observed the activities of the medical exercise - ROL1, which is organized by the American army and which is the continuation of the exercise carried out in the Republic of Montenegro during the past week. The purpose of

the exercise is to raise ROL1 medical capacities, exchange experiences, raise interoperability between regional states, as well as support from the KSF team for Albania and Montenegro for past experience during the validation process. Apart from KSF, Albania, Montenegro, IOWA National Guard, MAINE National Guard and USAFE/EUCOM are also part of the exercise.

They also visited the General Headquarters of the KSF. During this visit, cooperation between the KSF and the Iowa National Guard was discussed, including plans and objectives for the next three years. In line with the objectives of the COMKSF, the details of the cooperation plan between the two institutions are revealed, focusing on the areas of



maneuver, logistic support, medicine, cybernetics, as well as training of non-commissioned officers. These discussions were held in the context of common goals for raising the level of cooperation and coordination between the two forces. Following the visit, Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari, and the Commander of the Iowa Guard, Major General Stephen E. Osborn together with their delegations, visited the Third Infantry Regiment of the Land Forces in Mitrovica, where both generals were informed about the activities, training and achievements of this unit. The regiments of the Land Forces of the Kosovo Security Force are carrying out activities according to the planning and development of combat capacities with the aim of validation according to the Comprehensive Transition Plan (CTP).



MINISTER MAQEDONCI HOSTED THE MEMBERS OF THE SECURITY AND DEFENSE COMMITTEE OF THE GERMAN BUNDESTAG AT THE MEETING



Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci hosted the members of the Security and Defense Committee of the German Bundestag, led by the chairman of this Committee, Marie Agnes Strack Zimmermann. Minister Maqedonci informed the attendees about the security situation in the country. In particular, the minister emphasized the threat posed by the military bases of Serbia, located along the border with Kosovo, for the stability of the country and the region, asserting that it should be a concern for the entire international factor. Likewise, minister Maqedonci informed the members of this Committee about the current capacities that the KSF has to guarantee the protection of the territorial integrity of the Republic of Kosovo and the lives of our citizens. He reiterated that our goal as a country is NATO membership, according to the standards of which the alliance is continuing with the implementation of the Comprehensive Transition Plan, building the professional and operational capacities of our army. At the end of the meeting, the minister expressed his gratitude for the long-term support of the German state to the Republic of Kosovo, the increased presence of German troops within KFOR, as well as the commitment of this Committee in the direction of deepening the cooperation between our countries in the field of security and defense, as two states that share common interests. Also, in this meeting was the Commander of the KSF, Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari, the Deputy Minister of Defense, Shemsi Syla, Deputy General Secretary of the Ministry of Defense, Gafurr Dugolli, the military attaché of the KSF in Germany, lieutenant colonel Besim Gashi and the head of the cabinet of minister Maqedonci, Afërdita Zeqiri.

KSF PART OF THE “KFOR 33” FIELD EXERCISE IN GERMANY

Within the framework of bilateral cooperation and the invitation accepted by the USA, a contingent of the Kosovo Security Force with members of the EOD and observers/controllers, participated in the Field Exercise “KFOR 33” in Hohenfels, Germany. Field exercise “KFOR 33” is a multinational exercise in which more than ten partner states of the USA participate and is carried out at the American military base in Germany (JMRC- Hohenfels). The exercise is designed to test and assess the readiness of the combat units of the Infantry Brigade Combat Teams (48 IBCT) as part of rotations for the KFOR mission in Kosovo and also prepares partner states for joint operations.

THE TRAINING CURRICULUM FOR THE STATE CYBER SECURITY TRAINING CENTER WAS APPROVED



In the premises of the Ministry of Defense, the Training Curriculum for the State Training Center for Cyber Security has been approved. The drafting of this curriculum, which was approved by the Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, has been supported by the Embassy of the United Kingdom and implemented by DCAF with local and international experts. Minister Maqedonci emphasized the importance of this event, describing it as a very important step in the fight against hybrid attacks and threats, which is now being faced by Kosovo and other countries in the region and beyond. These threats and attacks are now also of global proportions. The minister thanked the Embassy of the United Kingdom, DCAF and all the representatives of the institutions, who contributed to the drafting of the Curriculum, and expressed his gratitude to all contributors.



MINISTER MAQEDONCI HOSTED FOR A VISIT THE AMBASSADOR OF ISRAEL, TAMAR ZIV

In the premises of the Ministry of Defense, the Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci welcomed the Ambassador of Israel, Tamar Ziv, with whom, among other things, they discussed about the development of the Kosovo Security Force, security in the country, the region and beyond. In addition, Minister Maqedonci and Ambassador Ziv also discussed the continuation and deepening of cooperation between the two countries in the field of security and defense.

In the Ministry of Defense, a bilateral meeting was held in the field of defense and security between the Department for International Cooperation of the MoD and representatives of the Armed Forces of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan. On this occasion, the bilateral plan of activities for the year 2024 was signed, a plan which will offer professional and advanced training for members of the KSF. The bilateral plan was signed by the Director of Defense Policy, Faruk Geci and the Director of Planning and Organization from the Jordanian army, Brigadier General Tariq Al Hayaia.



THE MINISTRY OF DEFENSE AND KSF SIGN A MEMORANDUM OF COOPERATION WITH THE MINISTRY OF INTERNAL AFFAIRS-THE KOSOVO ACADEMY FOR PUBLIC SECURITY



Deputy Minister of Defense, Shemsi Sylja and Acting Secretary General of the Ministry of Defense, Gafurr Dugolli, have received the deputy director of the Kosovo Academy for Public Security (AKSP) Kastriot Jashari, accompanied by his colleagues. On this occasion, a Memorandum of Cooperation was signed, which aims to define mutual cooperation between KSF and AKSP, in raising

and developing the capacities of security and defense members. This Memorandum was signed by the head of the Operations and Training Sector of the General Staff of the KSF, Colonel Astrit Haliti and the deputy director of AKSP Kastriot Jashari. Within the scope of cooperation, among others, the provision of training programs is also included, as well as mutual cooperation in raising the quality and professional capacities, the exchange of experiences and knowledge of training, research and development in the field of security and defense through the exchange of personnel, etc.



MINISTER MAQEDONCI HOSTED FOR A MEETING THE MAYOR OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF GILAN, ALBAN HYSENI

In the framework of inter-institutional cooperation, the Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, hosted the Mayor of the Municipality of Gjilan, Alban Hyseni. In the meeting, among other things, was discussed the level of cooperation so far, assessing the need for further intensification in the areas of general interest, with special emphasis in the field of emergencies and infrastructural projects of vital importance to citizens. Cooperation between local and central government

institutions is continuous and in the service of improving the life and safety of citizens.

DEPUTY MINISTER OF DEFENSE, SHEMSI SYLA, TOGETHER WITH HIS TEAM, VISITED THE MUNICIPALITIES OF DRENAS, OBILIQ, FUSHE KOSOVO AND FERIZAJ



Following the working meetings with the municipalities, the professional team from the Ministry of Defense, led by the Deputy Minister of Defense, Shemsi Sylja, in February visited the municipalities of Drenas, Obiliq, Fushë Kosovës and Ferizaj. Issues of emergency preparedness at the local level, for the management of natural disasters and other disasters, were discussed with the mayors of these municipalities.

The emphasis of the discussions was on the assessment of risks and dangerousness and the parts of this assessment such as: preventive plans, scenarios for exercises and the definition and preparation of shelters in cases of evacuation and shelter of the affected population, from natural disasters or any other disaster. They also discussed the issues of drafting Emergency Operational Plans, the establishment of Municipal Committees for Protection and Rescue and the establishment of Local Operational Centers, then the drafting of Emergency Response Plans for facilities of special importance such as schools and nurseries, as well as the establishment, training and certification of response units, whether professional or voluntary. Deputy Minister Sylja, offered support to the mayors of these municipalities both in the drafting of basic documents, as well as in the training and certification of response units, whether professional or volunteer teams in urban search and rescue, mountain search and rescue, water search and rescue, first aid, hazardous materials, etc.





Ashkali Day and the 21st anniversary of their national flag day were marked at the Ministry of Defense, where the Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci has organized an official reception for the KSF soldiers from the Ashkali

community. Also, the Deputy Minister of Defense, Adnan Rexhepllar, participated in this ceremony, Deputy Commander of the KSF, Major General Enver Cikaqi, Deputy Minister of the Ministry of Industry, Entrepreneurship and Trade, Resul Makreshi, Director of the NATO Advisory and Liaison Team (NALT), Brigadier General Ralph Hammerstein, and the chairman of the Ashkali Party for Integration, Hetem Arifi.
