KOSOVO UPGRADED TO NATO ASSOCIATE MEMBER STATUS

*Kosovo becomes an
ASSOCIATE MEMBER
of the NATO Parliamentary Assembly!*



Effective May 27, the NATO Parliamentary Assembly has granted the Assembly of the Republic of Kosovo the status of a NATO associate member. As a result, Kosovo now has the privilege to propose and provide input on any matters addressed by the NATO Assembly.

Minister of Defense Ejup Maqedonci highlighted that this decision brings Kosovo one step closer to full membership in the NATO Parliamentary Assembly, a development that will undoubtedly impact the stability of the Balkans.



MINISTER MAQEDONCI AND DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER SCHWARZ ATTENDED DEFENSE CONFERENCE “DEFENSE 24”

Minister of Defense Ejup Maqedonci, along with Deputy Prime Minister Donika Gërvalla-Schwarz and the rest of the delegation from the Ministry of Defense, participated in the “Defense 24” Conference, which was held in Poland. During the conference, Minister Maqedonci had productive meetings with the Polish Minister of Defense and Lithuania’s Deputy Minister, Žilvinas Tomkus. They discussed new forms of cooperation between their countries and the continuation of joint efforts within the Group for the Protection of Ukraine, as part of the Demining Coalition.

Also, during the conference Minister Maqedonci had a meeting with Władysław Kosiniak-Kamysz, the Minister of National Defense of Poland. Minister Maqedonci briefed his Polish counterpart on the security situation in Kosovo and the broader region. He expressed concern about Serbia’s militarization, particularly the presence of 48 Serbian army and gendarmerie bases along the border with Kosovo. Additionally, he raised suspicions that terrorist groups might be receiving support from Serbian security structures, potentially destabilizing Kosovo and the Balkans. Given the ongoing conflict in Ukraine and its implications for European security, Minister Maqedonci reaffirmed Kosovo’s unwavering support for Ukraine within its state capacities. Both ministers agreed on the importance of establishing defense cooperation between Kosovo and Poland.



Within the margins of the “Defense 24” conference, Minister Maqedonci, also had the opportunity to meet the Deputy Minister of Lithuania, Žilvinas Tomkus, the Deputy Minister of South Korea, Sung IL, the former Minister of Defense of Poland, as well as the Member of Parliament, Mariusz Błaszczak.

With the deputy minister of South Korea, they discussed the forms of how to establish military cooperation between Kosovo and South Korea, with special emphasis on the defense industry. While with the Deputy Minister of Lithuania, they discussed new forms of cooperation between the two countries and also the continuation of cooperation within the Group for the Protection of Ukraine, as part of the Demining Coalition.

Also, Minister Maqedonci visited the stations of the manufacturing companies of the defense industry, which presented the latest technology products.

On this occasion, he emphasized that in the last three years it has been invested in increasing the capacities of our army many times more than in the previous fifteen years. “We will continue the investment in accordance with the operational plan, requirements and needs of the



Kosovo Security Force”, said the minister, adding that from 2025, the third phase of the implementation of the Comprehensive Transition Plan will begin.

MINISTER MAQEDONCI PARTICIPATED IN PANEL DISCUSSION ON “STABILIZATION MISSIONS AS AN INSTRUMENT FOR PEACEKEEPING”



Minister of Defense Ejup Maqedonci participated in the discussion panel titled “Stabilization Missions as an Instrument for Maintaining Peace” during the “Defense 24” conference. In his speech, he emphasized the indispensable role of NATO member states and their successful intervention in Kosovo, which aimed to halt the genocide and liberate the country.

Here is the full speech delivered by Minister of Defense Ejup Maqedonci during the discussion panel:

“Kosovo as an independent state with the greatest economic growth in the Balkans, the most visible development in media freedom, freedom of speech, is a success story of the NATO mission, but unfortunately we cannot

say that the risk no longer exists in the Balkans.

While the Russian aggression is taking place in Ukraine, the extension of Russia in the Balkans, Serbia, the same country that caused the war in 1999 in Kosovo, continues to have an aggressive approach to Kosovo.

The attack in Banjska in September of last year proved that the same hegemonic mindset continues to exist among Serbia's ruling leadership.

The terrorist groups of the attack in Banjska were financed by the Serbian government institutions, as well as parallel institutions and smuggling groups in the north of Kosovo, with the primary goal of destabilizing the state of Kosovo.

The deployment of three of the four brigades of the Serbian Army near the border with Kosovo, with around 48 military

bases, is a concern for us, as is the fact that this country with a hostile approach continues to invest in the acquisition of offensive weapons systems.

The interests of Serbia and Russia are mutual, dated since the 18th century.

An unstable situation in the Balkans would serve both Russia in the continuation of the war with the aim of annexing Ukraine, and Serbia in feeding the illusory idea of creating Greater Serbia.

It is obvious that Serbia is much closer to eastern policies than

western ones, therefore it is very important to continue the presence of NATO troops in Kosovo, as long as we do not have clear signs of reflection on the part of Serbia and its entire democratization”.



MINISTER MAQEDONCI AND UNITED KINGDOM ARMED FORCES MINISTER LEO DOCHERTY SIGN A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING



Minister of Defense Ejup Maqedonci, together with the Minister of the Armed Forces of the United Kingdom, Leo Docherty, has signed a Memorandum of Understanding between the Ministry of Defense of the Republic of Kosovo and the Ministry of Defense of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. This agreement further strengthens the excellent bilateral cooperation in the field of defense between our two countries. It includes coordination to support the integration of the Republic of

Kosovo into NATO, joint exercises and training implementation, as well as support and training for international operations and military missions. Additionally, the exchange of experiences in other fields is a key component of this collaboration.

The Ministry of Defense of the Republic of Kosovo expresses gratitude to the United Kingdom for its unwavering and continuous support in developing our country's defense capacities.

The official visit to the United Kingdom, the Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, started with the meeting at the Department of Exports of Security and Defense of the United Kingdom, where he met with the director of this institution, Mark Goldsack and his staff, with whom they held fruitful discussions regarding the possibilities of future cooperation.

The ambassador of the Republic of Kosovo in London, Ilir Kapiti, as well as the defense attaché in the United Kingdom, Colonel Agron Bajrami, were also present at this meeting.

“The United Kingdom continues to be a special

strategic partner in the development of the military capacities of our country”, emphasized the Minister Maqedonci. During the official visit to the United Kingdom, the Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, was received at the Embassy of the Republic of Kosovo in London by Ambassador Ilir Kapiti and the Embassy staff. In the meeting led by the Secretary of Defense of the United States of America, Lloyd Austin, discussed the current situation in Ukraine, and the military assistance that countries should continue to provide to Ukraine and its people facing the Russian aggressor. Kosovo stands with Ukraine because it is with the right, the freedom of the people and the indisputable sovereignty of the states.

They also discussed about the development of the Kosovo Security Force in recent years, within the Comprehensive Transition Plan. At the same time, the minister requested that the assistance and partnership with Germany be further deepened. "Cooperation with Germany as a NATO member state is essential for the development of our

army, but also for peace and security in the country and the region", said Minister Maqedonci.

A BILATERAL MEETING BETWEEN THE J-4 OF THE MINISTRY OF DEFENSE OF THE REPUBLIC OF KOSOVO AND THE REPUBLIC OF CROATIA WAS HELD



In the framework of bilateral cooperation, according to the joint bilateral plan, on May 14 and 15, 2024, a bilateral meeting was held in Kosovo between the J-4 leaders of the Republic of Kosovo and the Republic of Croatia.

The Croatian delegation was led by Brigadier General Jozo Matković, head of the Directorate of Logistics in the GS of the Croatian armed forces. The delegation was received by the director of the Support Directorate, Zijadin Bajcinca and from the director of the Department for Logistics and Infrastructure of the Ministry of Interior, Colonel Imer Avdiu.

The focus of the visit was in the field of logistics. The function and system of Logistics at the Strategic, Operational and Tactical level was presented by the MoD. During the visit, in addition to the Ministry of Defense, the Department of Logistics at GSKSF was visited, as well as the Logistics Command. While the Croatian delegation from the point of view of logistics has disclosed its experiences regarding the criteria and requirements that must be met for membership in NATO. Also, the Croatian delegation shared its experiences in the landing of troops for various missions, as well as the management and standardization of equipment. In the end, both parties agreed that mutual cooperation in the field of logistics in support of common goals is necessary and fruitful for both parties, and therefore should continue in the future.



During this visit, the Croatian delegation was led by the Chief of the Logistics Directorate at the General Staff of the Armed Forces of the Republic of Croatia, Brigadier General Jozo Matkovic. He was received at the meeting by the Chief of Staff of the General Staff of the KSF, Brigadier General Ilir Qeriqi together with colleagues Colonel Imer Avdiu and Colonel Arsim Shaqiri. The two generals in the framework of bilateral cooperation talked about the possibilities of cooperation between the two armies and agreed on the exchange of experiences not only in the field of logistics but also in other functional areas with the aim of developing skills and capacities for interoperability and NATO standards -s.





- In addition, the delegation from the Croatian army was hosted for a meeting by the Acting Director, Commander of Logistics, Colonel Lladrovci. The Colonel Lladrovci received at the meeting the delegation from the Croatian Army led by the Chief of the Directorate of Logistics of the General Staff Brigadier General Jozo Matkovic.

In the “Efes 24” exercise, held in Izmir, Republic of Türkiye, the KSF Contingent has managed to successfully achieve the training objectives, which were planned for the first phase, to continue with the second phase in it, which envisages more complicated operations with the air force and in cooperation with the Turkish commando forces. The exercise includes mission groups, where the participants act as part of a Combined Joint Task Force (CJTf), and the main objective of the exercise is to exchange military expertise, improve interoperability and understanding between partner countries and agencies that are part of the exercise.



Deputy Minister of Defense, Shemsi Sylja accompanied by the Commander of the LFC, Brigadier General Hysen Dreshaj, the defense attaché in Türkiye, Colonel Bekim Zejnullahu, as well as the delegation from the KSF soldiers, visited the military base in Türkiye, where “EFES 2024” Exercise took place. On this occasion, Deputy Minister Sylja was warmly received by the commander of this camp, Colonel Ismail Ibishi, who informed them about the course of the exercise and more broadly about the contingent of our soldiers from the Third Regiment of the Land Forces. The colonel in this meeting said the best possible words about the discipline, successes, professionalism and readiness that the KSF soldiers have shown throughout this exercise. Then, as part of this official visit to Türkiye, they visited the camp of KSF soldiers, where they were received by the commander of the KSF contingent in Türkiye, Major Ali

Krasniqi, who informed them in detail about the exercise, the objectives of his, the interoperability with the participating armies, as well as the challenges for the entire exercise. He also mentioned the warm and very friendly welcome from the Turkish military, as well as the ideal care and conditions. As for our soldiers, Deputy Minister Sylja congratulated them on the successes achieved which make us all proud. This exercise, which was carried out in three dimensions: from land, air and sea, is expected to be finalized the day after tomorrow and which will be conveyed by the representatives of the 45 countries that have participated, where 50 countries present on the “D” day, with the commitment of more than 12 thousand troops and with the use of the most sophisticated weapons of military technology of the Turkish state.

Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, at the invitation of the American Chamber of Commerce in Kosovo, participated in the round table with the topic “Strengthening partnerships for national security”. Discussions focused on the global security environment, security in the Western Balkans region and the need for the development of the defense industry in the country in order to face future security challenges. In a conversation with the executive director of ACCK, Arian Zeka, as well as other members of this chamber, the Minister Maqedonci emphasized that “the development of the defense industry is one of the basic prerequisites for completing the defense infrastructure of a country. Especially for our country and the time in which we are facing regional and global security challenges”. Further,

“LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT AND CIVIL EDUCATION” SEMINAR WAS HELD AT THE MINISTRY OF DEFENSE



Within the framework of the activities from the bilateral cooperation plan for 2024, the one-week seminar “Leadership development and civic education” was held in the premises of the Ministry of Defense, organized by the Department for International Cooperation and Euro-Atlantic Integration of the MoD and by the military of the German army.

On this occasion, the director of the Human Resources Directorate of MoD, Ismet Mecinaj, in his welcoming speech for those present, thanked the German side for the cooperation and continuous support for the Ministry of Defense and the KSF. At the Ministry of Defense, a one-week seminar on “Acquisition, planning, market research and cost analysis” was completed, with trainers from the Institute for Security and Governance (ISG), International Defense Acquisition Resource Management (IDARM) and the Office for Cooperation Military at the American Embassy (ODC).

This seminar was attended by members from the Ministry of Defense, the KSF, as well as from other security agencies. The focus of the workshop was to examine the fundamental concepts and challenges associated with managing acquisition projects in the defense field. In this workshop, the participants critically reviewed and applied various, detailed elements of market research as an integral part of the project. This workshop provided an overview of the fundamental concepts and challenges associated with procurement planning, market research, and cost and price analysis.



KSF TRAINS FOR “VURAN” COMBAT VEHICLES

In the framework of the cooperation with the Turkish army, and with the aim of increasing the combat capacities of the Kosovo Security Force, the training for the safe and efficient use of “Vuran” combat vehicles was carried out by the instructors of the Turkish army. The Kosovo Security Force, based on the development plan, is raising its capacities with the support of international partners, thus creating interoperability and rising to the highest standards of NATO armies.

KSF PART OF THE “VIGOROUS WARRIOR 24” FIELD EXERCISE
