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BRIGADIER GENERAL CHRISTIAN NAWRAT: THE NEW DIRECTOR OF NATO ADVISORY AND LIAISON TEAM



At the Ministry of Defense in April was held the ceremony of accepting and handing over the duties of the director of the NATO Advisory and Liaison Team (NALT), where the director, Brigadier General Ralf Hammerstein, who has led the NALT since March 2023, handed over the task to his successor, Brigadier General Christian Nawrat. The Prime Minister Kurti emphasized that cooperation with dedicated people, such as General Hammerstein, is an important experience for all of us. "His unwavering commitment to raising standards within our security institutions has left an indelible mark and legacy which we must continue to exalt", he said.

The Minister of Defense Ejup Maqedonci, evaluating the work of

General Hammerstein, said: "Our main strategic goal is the membership of the Republic of Kosovo in NATO. Therefore, our main priority is building the professional and operational capacities of the KSF in accordance with NATO standards".



Speaking about the results of General Hammerstein's work, the minister Maqedonci emphasized that through his commitment, General Hammerstein has provided an important contribution to increasing the effectiveness of the Ministry of Defense and the Kosovo Security Force, giving input in every process that helps to fulfill of the high standards required for NATO membership. MINISTER MAQEDONCI WELCOMED UK'S SPECIAL ENVOY FOR THE WESTERN BALKANS, LORD STUART PEACH



The Minister of Defence, Ejup Maqedonci, hosted the United Kingdom's Special Envoy for the Western Balkans, Lord Stuart Peach, accompanied by Ambassador Jonathan Hargreaves.

In this meeting, the security situation in the country and the region, the development of the KSF, as well as the Interflex operation that is being developed in the United Kingdom, with the participation of the KSF troop, were discussed.

The Minister Maqedonci expressed his gratitude for the continuous support that the United Kingdom has offered to Kosovo in matters of security, preservation of territorial integrity, especially with the addition of its troops within KFOR, after the terrorist and paramilitary attack on September 24 last year in Banjska.

On this occasion, the Minister Maqedonci emphasized the unwavering commitment to maintaining stability and fulfilling our goal as a country for membership in NATO and the EU.

THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY DONATES MULTIPURPOSE TRUCKS TO KOSOVO SECURITY FORCE



A donation ceremony was held at the ‘Adem Jashari’ barracks in Pristina, where the Kosovo Security Force graciously received five multifunctional trucks from the Federal Republic of Germany. This generous contribution will significantly enhance the operational capabilities of the KSF.

The handover ceremony was marked by the presence of esteemed figures, including Minister of Defense Ejup Maqedonci, KSF Commander General Bashkim Jashari, and the German Ambassador to Kosovo, Jörn Rohde as well as local and international officials and senior officers.

Regarding this activity, in his speech, Minister Maqedonci emphasized: “It is a special pleasure and honor that today I accept the next donation of the Federal Republic of Germany, military trucks of the company Rheinmetall MAN, in the amount of 2.7 million euros, which will affect in raising the logistical and operational capacity of the Kosovo Security Force”.

Furthermore, he emphasized that the support with military vehicles for the KSF is only one of the areas where Germany contributes significantly to the defense and security of our country.



At the end of his speech, the minister warned that soon the agreement of understanding between the two countries will be signed and that Germany will appoint a resident attaché in Kosovo, with the aim of advancing the army to the level of NATO standards, to contribute to peace and security in the country, region and beyond.

While, in his speech, the ambassador of Germany, Mr. Rohde said: "I want to reiterate that the relations between Kosovo and Germany are excellent and we have a close cooperation with the Ministry of Defense and the KSF, especially in the field of security. Soon we will sign a Memorandum of Understanding and through the deputy military attache of

Germany we will have permanent representation in Kosovo".

Further, he specified that the purpose of this donation is to support the initial capacities of the Transport Company of the Logistics Regiment. In March of this year, the Ministry of Defense purchased from its own budget 10 trucks of the brand "Rheinmetall MAN", the same as those that were donated today by the Federal Republic of Germany.

MINISTER MAQEDONCI PARTICIPATED IN THE CENTRAL EUROPEAN DEFENSE COOPERATION MINISTERIAL



The Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, participated in the Ministerial of Defense Cooperation of Central Europe (Central European Defense Cooperation, CEDC) and partner countries of the Western Balkans (WB), which took place in Budapest, Hungary. On this occasion, the minister once again confirmed the strategic orientation of the Republic of Kosovo for membership in the EU and NATO and asked for support of the countries participating in this format, for the realization of these aspirations of our country, to enable us to make the greatest contribution for peace and security in the region and the world. In his address, Minister Maqedonci also reiterated the importance of

supporting Ukraine in its just struggle for the preservation of sovereignty and the protection of territorial integrity, while at the same time he informed those present about the country's contribution to support Ukraine, in accordance with its capacities and resources. our country. Also, the minister Maqedonci emphasized the fact that those responsible for the September 24 terrorist attack in Banjska i Zveçani continue to be free and unpunished for the act committed.

MINISTER MAQEDONCI MET HIS HUNGARIAN COUNTERPART, MINISTER OF DEFENSE KRISTÓF SZALAY-BOBROVNICZKY



On the sidelines of the Security Congress that was held in Budapest, Minister Maqedonci met his counterpart Szalay-Bobrovniczky. During the meeting, they discussed the general security situation and their impact in the Western Balkans, with particular emphasis on the attack in the north of the country and the policies aimed at destabilizing the Balkans. As two democratic states that believe in Western values, the possibility of deepening bilateral cooperation in the field of defense was also discussed, while the goal of Kosovo to be a member of the European Union and NATO was reiterated by the Minister Maqedonci

THE MINISTER OF DEFENSE, EJUP MAQEDONCI, ATTENDED THE BUDAPEST SECURITY FORUM

As part of the official visit to Hungary for participation in the Central European and Western Balkans Defense Cooperation Ministerial, the Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, participated in the Budapest Security Forum, which was held for the first time in the Hungarian capital. The Minister Maqedonci, together with the Minister of Defense of Montenegro, Dragan Krapović, was part of the panel that discussed the topic "Central Europe and the Western Balkans in the new European security architecture". In his speech, the minister expressed his position, stressing that the strategic orientation and aspiration of the Republic of Kosovo for membership in NATO and the EU has no other alternative.

Further, the Minister Maqedonci informed about the development of the capacities of the Kosovo Security Force and the way forward, based on the General Transition Plan, as well as the needs in accordance with recent developments in the general security environment. During his stay in Budapest, the Minister Maqedonci also met with the Minister of Defense of Hungary, Kristóf Szalay-Bobrovniczky. With the Hungarian counterpart, in addition to the general security situation and their influence in our region, they also discussed the possibilities of deepening bilateral cooperation in the field of defense.



MINISTER MAQEDONCI ATTENDED THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE “WOMEN, PEACE AND SECURITY”

During the session of the International Conference on Women, Peace, and Security, Minister of Defense Ejup Maqedonci underscored the indispensable contributions of women in the armed forces, advocating for their continued empowerment and participation.

Below is his full speech:

The active participation of women in peace and security matters is fundamental to achieving enduring stability. Given that women constitute over half of our nation's population, their involvement in crisis management and the sustainable development of our forces is not merely important—it is essential.

Consequently, the increase in the number of women members in the army would contribute not only to strengthening the role of women but also to the strengthening of the army, because in general, and especially in our country, they have been and are a key factor and determinant of major changes.

At the moment we speak, the percentage of women in the KSF is somewhere close to 10%, and they are engaged in all links of the structure of the Force, both in the General Staff and in the Command, respectively in: the Command of the Land Forces, the Command of National Guard, Logistics and Doctrine and Training Command. The Inspector General is General Irfete Spahiu, and even the Defense Academy is led by a woman, Major Mimoza Budeci.

We are focused on giving even more voice to information campaigns about the possibility of developing a military career, with the image of the military woman at the center. But we will also continue to engage in the elimination of obstacles that in any form stagnate the advancement of the position of women in the Force.

In this direction, we are very determined that the composition of the recruiting and selection boards reflect a gender perspective, as a balanced and representative presence.

Military women today operate in better conditions, due to the work and continuous efforts to improve the conditions they have faced over the years, be it through open recruitment procedures, equal pay for the same rank for both sexes, guaranteeing and implementing the Law on Maternity Leave and Parental Leave, as well as the Law on Protection of Breastfeeding, enabling them paid holidays and breaks.

All these measures taken, and for the increase of the same, we

will not stop the efforts, are impetus and encouragement for the integration of women in the army. This is because women have proven that they are fully competent to perform all the tasks for which they have the will to commit.





During the Forum for Women, Peace, and Security, the Defense Minister, Ejup Maqedonci, and the Ambassador of the Republic of Kosovo to Canada, Adriatik Kryeziu, had a meeting with Rebecca Patterson, a member of the Canadian Senate. They were accompanied by Jonathan Berkshire Miller, the director of the Macdonald Laurier Institute, and Robert Baines, the president of the Canadian NATO Association. Maqedonci expressed his gratitude to his Canadian counterparts for their support of the Republic of

Kosovo, particularly in the field of defense. He emphasized the Ministry of Defense and the Kosovo Security Force's desire to further expand this cooperation.



During the Forum for Women, Peace, and Security, Defense Minister Ejup Maqedonci had a meeting with Ambassador Kate Marie Byrnes, the Foreign Policy Advisor at the US European Command. The US Ambassador to the Republic of Kosovo, Jeffrey Hovenier, also attended the meeting. In the meeting was discussed the implementation of the bilateral plan with the USA, the cooperation with the European Command of the USA, the development of the KSF into a professional army, as well as the next steps for Kosovo's membership in NATO. The minister thanked Ambassador Byrnes for EUCOM's support so far in advancing the professional capacities of the KSF, as well as the excellent

cooperation that exists in the current joint mission for the training of Ukrainian troops in the field of demining. Minister Maqedonci emphasized that maintaining peace and stability is essential and that all parties should be engaged for this.

MINISTER MAQEDONCI HOSTED THE FORMER MINISTER OF DEFENSE OF THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA IN A MEETING

The Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, hosted the former Minister of Defense of the Republic of South Africa, at the same time a member of the National Executive Committee of the African National Congress, Lindiwe Nonceba Sisulu. They discussed about the areas in which Kosovo can cooperate with South Africa, especially in the defense industry, where Africa ranks among the first in the list with the greatest development in this direction.



KSF AND EUCOM TRAIN THE 1ST GROUP OF THE UKRAINIAN CONTINGENT IN THE DEMINING FIELD



The six-week training of the first group of Ukrainian personnel in the field of EOD was carried out by KSF instructors, in cooperation with the European Command of the United States of America (EUCOM).

The ceremony was attended by the Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, the Commander of the KSF, Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari, the Ambassador of the United States of America in Kosovo, Mr. Jeffrey M. Hovenier, EUCOM representatives, as well as senior domestic and international officials and officers.

In his speech to the audience, the Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci emphasized that "the Republic of Kosovo stands firmly alongside the United States of America and other democratic countries in support of the just struggle of the people of Ukraine against the unprovoked and unjust Russian aggression". While the Commander of the Kosovo Security Force, Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari, after greeting those present and congratulating the trainees on the successful completion of this course, added: "Our people better than anyone else understand the importance of your fight against the aggressor and the high price that freedom has. Therefore, we are dedicated side by side with our allies to help the people of Ukraine in their efforts for freedom, just as our allies have helped us and stood by us in difficult times, where even today we are continuing the journey together". The KSF Commander also thanked the instructors from the KSF and EUCOM for the professionalism shown in the training of the Ukrainian contingent in the field of EOD. At the same time, he thanked the USA for its continuous support in the professional development of the KSF. Those present were also greeted by the American Ambassador in Kosovo, Jeffrey M. Hovenier, who expressed gratitude and happiness for this success. "I am honored to be with you today, where we are marking an extraordinary achievement of the completion of this course, which once again marks Kosovo's commitment and determination to defend the state of Ukraine from Russia's brutal attack".

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KSF PARTNERS WITH KFOR AND GLOBAL DEMINING GROUPS TO MARK APRIL 4TH, INTERNATIONAL MINE AWARENESS DAY



KSF together with KFOR and the international organizations for demining that operate in Kosovo marked the 4th of April - the International Day for mine awareness. Present at this ceremony were the Deputy Minister of Defense, Shemsi Sylja, the Commander of the National Guard of the KSF, Brigadier General, Naim Haziri, the advisor to the Minister of Defense, Hajriz Sejdiu, as well as the Director of the Coordinating Center for Demining in the MoD, Ahmet Sallova. Officials of the US and Japanese embassies were also present at this event.

On this occasion, Deputy Minister Sylja thanked the participants for their valuable work, noting that the constant presence of mined areas and other unexploded ordnance in the areas affected by them not only poses a danger to the lives of the residents, but also makes it difficult their economic situation, due to the non-use of these agricultural lands and mountainous areas. Meanwhile, Brigadier General Naim Haziri thanked all those present for their successes in cleaning the areas to create a safe environment for living and avoiding accidents from mines or other explosive devices. The director of the Coordinating Center for Demining in the MoD, Mr. Sallova presented the progress achieved, where since 1999 over 63 million square meters have been



cleared and 96 thousand mines and unexploded explosive devices have been found. He asserted that KSF demining units and other organizations involved in clearing hazardous areas, the NPA and the HALO Trust, are restoring and creating a safe environment in the current endangered areas, enabling normal life to develop. During this activity, all the organizations present presented the equipment and informed the attendees about the progress achieved so far. This day is marked in 60 countries of the world, affected by mines and explosive devices, to increase the awareness of the danger from mines and other explosive devices.

MINISTER MAQEDONCI HOSTED THE CZECH REPUBLIC DELEGATION

MINISTER MAQEDONCI PAID TRIBUTE TO THE CEMETERIES OF CIVILIANS IN GJAKOVA KILLED BY THE PARAMILITARY, MILITARY AND POLICE FORCES OF SERBIA



On the 25th anniversary of the massacre in the first district of the city of Gjakova, Minister Ejup Maqedonci, together with other state leaders, remembered the civilians killed by the paramilitary, military and police forces of Serbia. On this anniversary, Minister Maqedonci emphasized that "the sixty people killed are no longer among us, but we will remember them forever and we will not stop seeking justice for them". In this neighborhood, civilians of different ages from 2 to 75 years old, old men, women, men and children, were shot and burned alive by the Serbian criminal regime. The Human Rights Watch witness says that in the house

of the Vejsa family, the completely charred bodies of nineteen members of the Vejsa, Hoxha, Haxhiavdija, Caka, Gashi families were found, who were wrapped in a blanket and buried in three graves. To this day, none of the identified, superiors of the Serbian army and police as suspects for committing this crime has been brought to justice, while the mothers, sisters and other relatives of the victims anxiously await the day when justice will be decided.

KSF ORGANIZED THE "INTERNATIONAL CADET WEEK"

The Kosovo Security Force welcomed the cadets from the military academies of Canada, North Macedonia, Albania, the United States of America and Türkiye and held the international cadet week, organized for the first time by the Defense Academy of the KSF.
