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Kosovo Marks "Force Day"



The Ministry of Defense and the Kosovo Security Forces celebrated November 27th as the "Day of the Force" with a special ceremony and a variety of activities. The "Open Day" was held at the KSF barracks in Prishtina, Mitrovica, Istog, Gjilan, Prizren, Ferizaj, and Pomezatin, where citizens and students had the opportunity to see military equipment and weapons up close, attend various demonstrations, and participate in activities showcasing the strength and readiness of the KSF. The central ceremony took place at the "Adem Jashari" barracks in Prishtina, with the participation of the highest state leaders, including Prime Minister Albin Kurti, Minister of Defense Ejup Maqedonci, Commander of the KSF Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari, Deputy Minister Shemsi Sylja, and Adnan Redzeplari, as well as military and diplomatic representatives from partner countries.



On this special day, the Prime Minister and the Minister of Defense began their visit by inspecting the military capabilities of the KSF, which were on display for the public. In their statements to the media, they thanked the Commander of the KSF, General Jashari, and all the military personnel for their dedication and readiness in carrying out the sacred mission of defending the country. On this occasion, Minister Maqedonci emphasized that today is a special day for the KSF and that marking November 27th as "the Day of the Force" has now become a tradition. This tradition is linked to previous activities and the legacy of the liberation war, reflecting the KSF's development as an army over the years. He also noted that this day

was marked by an important step in completing the defense and security infrastructure – the start of the military industry, a key component for state sustainability in defense and security. Kosovo Leaders at The Halifax International Security Forum



The Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, together with the President of Kosovo, Vjosa Osmani, and the Commander of the KSF, Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari, participated in the Halifax International Security Forum in Canada, at the invitation of the Minister of National Defense of Canada, Bill Blair. This year's edition of the forum focused on the security challenges facing democratic countries, aiming to encourage strategic cooperation between them. In addition to participating in working sessions, they held bilateral meetings with other political and military representatives from partner countries. Minister Maqedonci and President Osmani met with the Chairman of NATO's Military Committee, Admiral

Bob Bauer, to discuss the security situation and Kosovo's commitment to NATO membership, reaffirming the continued dedication to this goal to ensure peace and security in the region and beyond. Additionally, Minister Maqedonci met with NATO's Assistant Secretary General, Boris Ruge, to discuss strengthening the security sector, a key factor for the country's stability and development, and for Euro-Atlantic integration. The Minister emphasized Kosovo's ongoing commitment to fulfilling its state duties for this process.



As part of the official visit to Halifax, the Commander of the Kosovo Security Force (COMKSF), Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari, participated in the closing meeting of defense chiefs from many countries around the world. This meeting was organized by the Chief of Defense of the Canadian Armed Forces, General Jennie Cagninan, with the participation of counterparts from various countries. General Jashari expressed his gratitude to his Canadian counterpart, appreciating Canada's continuous contribution since NATO's intervention in Kosovo to the present day. He also informed her about the situation in Kosovo and the region, highlighting the developments and achievements of the KSF. The discussions also covered the KSF's contribution to the training of Ukrainian groups and the strategic objectives for Kosovo's integration into NATO in the future. Kosovo's participation in this international forum and the meetings held demonstrate its unwavering commitment to security and international cooperation, bringing the country one step closer to Euro-Atlantic integration.

Minister of Defense Ejup Maqedonci and Prime Minister Albin Kurti Visit Static Points and Military Patrols

Minister Maqedonci, together with Prime Minister Albin Kurti, visited static points and military patrols located along the water channel in the regions of Obiliq and Vushtrri to talk to the members of the Force engaged there. The KSF is engaged in patrolling and securing key points of Kosovo's critical infrastructure to protect against any threats and hostile forces targeting Kosovo and its citizens. These tasks arise from decisions made at the latest meeting

of the Security Council regarding the engagement of the Force in support of civil authorities. The Commander of the KSF, Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari, and the General Staff have planned the engagement of units at key points of critical physical infrastructure in Kosovo. The security institutions of the Republic of Kosovo are in full and continuous inter-institutional coordination to respond to the needs of state and citizen protection, as well as the challenges of the security environment. Following the terrorist attack on the Iber-Lepenc canal in the village of Varage, Zubin Potok, the Kosovo Security Force has increased its engagement to fulfill its mission to protect Kosovo's sovereignty and territorial integrity and to support civil authorities.

Protection of Critical Water Infrastructure: Inter-Institutional Cooperation and Emergency Plan

In the framework of inter-institutional cooperation for military support to civil authorities, with a focus on the management and protection of critical water supply infrastructure, the Deputy Minister of Defense, Shemsi Sylja, held a meeting with the Chief Executive of Regional Water Company Prishtina, Arsim Fetahu. On this occasion, Mr. Fetahu informed Deputy Minister Sylja about the activities and commitments of his team to ensure uninterrupted water supply and the improvement of the water management network, emphasizing the importance of security and stability in daily operations. At the end of the meeting, Deputy Minister Sylja visited the main facilities of the enterprise to observe the work being carried out and explore opportunities for further support. As part of the commitments for military support to civil authorities and to ensure the security of critical infrastructure, in November, Deputy Minister Sylja, together with the Chief Executive of the Hydro-Economic Enterprise "Iber Lepenc", Faruk Mujka, visited Ujmani Lake. During the visit, discussions were held on risk assessment and the preparation of an emergency response plan for the protection of the dam from natural and other risks. Additionally, training was provided for the enterprise personnel in the field of emergency response to strengthen their skills in critical situations. During this visit, the achievements and ongoing projects being implemented at the "Iber Lepenc" Enterprise were closely presented, highlighting the dedication and commitment of the team to improving services and increasing the security of the facilities under its management.



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Cooperation for Security of Energy Infrastructure in Kosovo

KSF and AFRA Conduct Joint Exercise "Rescue 2024" in Pomezatin



At the “Young Europeans” Barracks in Pomezatin, the joint exercise “Rescue 2024” was held between units of the Kosovo Security Forces (KSF) National Guard and the Armed Forces of the Republic of Albania (AFRA). The purpose of this exercise was to enhance interoperability between units and provide military support to civil authorities in cases of natural disasters (civil emergencies). During the exercise, the teams demonstrated their capabilities in the elimination of hazardous materials, disposal of unexploded ordnance, search and rescue of individuals trapped under rubble, K9 search capabilities, providing support with engineering machinery, and offering first aid to the injured. At the end of the exercise, Colonel Skender Hoxha, the Acting Commander of the KSF National Guard, greeted and thanked the participants on behalf of the KSF Commander. He expressed gratitude for their efforts and the successful cooperation between the two forces.



Technical Training of Kobra Armored Vehicles by the Turkish Army for the KSF

The “Basic Infantry Officer Course” was completed at the Training and Doctrine Command in Ferizaj, conducted for the first time by instructors from the Kosovo Security Force with support from the American SATMO and ODC teams. At the certification ceremony, the Chief of Staff of the General Staff, Brigadier General Ilir Qeriqi, and the Commander of Doctrine and Training, Brigadier General Jeton Dreshaj, attended and congratulated the members of the Force for successfully completing the course. This course, based on a detailed program that combined theory and practice, prepared the graduates with advanced infantry tactical skills and leadership on the battlefield, as well as assessed them for their leadership potential, leading by example, and teamwork. The course also included recent graduates from prestigious academies such as West Point, Sandhurst, Albania, and USC (University Study Centre). The goal of the course was to advance and professionally increase military leadership to face current and future challenges.

KSF Officer, Durim Behluli, has successfully completed the Career Captain’s Course in Artillery at the Field Artillery School in Oklahoma, USA. The course included around 50 officers from 10 different countries and aimed to prepare officers for duties as staff officers at the battalion-brigade level and as artillery battery commanders.
