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National Comprehensive Defense Program Approved by Kosovo Government



The Government of the Republic of Kosovo has approved the National Comprehensive Defense Program. On this occasion, Defense Minister Ejup Maqedonci stated that, based on the government program, changes in the strategic security environment, and the goal of strengthening the defense system of the Republic of Kosovo, the National Comprehensive Defense Program has been drafted. This program is divided into specific pillars within the plan.

"As we build and develop the Kosovo Security Force in line with the Comprehensive Transition Plan, the Comprehensive Defense Program lays the foundation for preparing and educating citizens and institutions about their roles in our defense system, protecting the information space from malicious misinformation, ensuring the continuity of essential supplies and services during crises, and working on the functionality of collective shelters," emphasized Minister Maqedonci.

The Comprehensive Defense Program is based on similar systems applied in various NATO countries and enables central and local institutions, especially the citizens of the Republic and various non-governmental organizations, to have their role in the country's defense and security system. This program aims to build national resilience so that our society is prepared to withstand, respond to, and recover from natural disasters or armed attacks.

KSF and Iowa National Guard: Strength in Unity



Under the partnership between the Kosovo Security Force and the Iowa National Guard of the USA, a delegation from the ING headquarters in Iowa spent a week visiting the Ministry of Defense and KSF. They conducted joint visits and meetings with the KSF headquarters to closely observe the development and achievements of the KSF in building military skills and capacities. The high-level delegation from Iowa, led by the Deputy Commander of the Iowa National Guard, Brigadier General McClintock, and the Chief of Staff of the Iowa Air National Guard, Brigadier General Stephanie Samenus, held meetings with the Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci, and the Commander of the Kosovo Security Force, Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari.

During the visit, the Iowa delegation was informed about the processes of planning training, operations, recruitment and retention of personnel, as well as the concept of logistical support. They were also briefed on the execution of the 3-year cooperation plan with Iowa in the fields of maneuver, development of non-commissioned officers, sustainability, cybernetics, and medicine.





Minister Maqedonci thanked the United States of America and in particular the IOWA National Guard for the exemplary cooperation with the KSF and requested that this cooperation be deepened and expanded even further. He emphasized that this visit confirms the close cooperation with the United States of America as a strategic partner and primary supporter in enhancing the skills and capacities of the KSF. The delegation continued their visit to the General Staff, the Defense Academy, the Cybernetics and

Communication Unit, and the Land Forces Command. During the visit at the Land Forces Command, they were welcomed by the Commander of Land Forces, Brigadier General Hysen Dreshaj, staff, and the Commanders of the three Infantry Regiments. They discussed the achievements and plans of the LFC and closely observed the capabilities of the infantry, which were presented to the Iowa National Guard delegation.



Additionally, during this week-long visit, KSF Commander Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari met with Sergeant Major Matthew Strasser of the Iowa National Guard Command and his delegation. They discussed the ongoing support from the Iowa National Guard in developing the non-commissioned officer corps, a primary goal of COMKSF. General Jashari expressed gratitude to Sergeant Major Strasser for the significant role Iowa National Guard non-commissioned officers

have played in the education, training, and development of the KSF non-commissioned officer corps.

Strengthening ties with the Iowa National Guard continues to be a top priority in our international cooperation efforts.

Minister Maqedonci and KSF Commander Attended Ukraine Defense Contact Group Meeting

Defense Minister Ejup Maqedonci and KSF Commander Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari attended the meeting of the Ukraine Defense Contact Group, held on September in Ramstein, Germany. During this meeting, the Republic of Kosovo has offered its third assistance package to Ukraine, continuing the support provided through the two previous packages and training for the Ukrainian military. The meeting, chaired by U.S. Secretary of Defense Lloyd Austin and Ukrainian Defense Minister Rustem Umerov, also featured participation from Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, who expressed his gratitude for the assistance extended to his country. The focus of the meeting was on continuing military support in the form of arms, equipment, and training for Ukraine's armed forces from coalition countries.



The Ukraine Defense Contact Group comprises defense ministers and chiefs from over 50 countries, forming a large coalition of Ukraine supporters since the start of Russian aggression.

Minister Maqedonci Hosted the President of the Defense Industry Agency of the Republic of Türkiye, Haluk Gorgun



During this friendly meeting, they discussed the close cooperation in the field of defense between our two countries. Special attention was given to investment in the defense industry. "The Republic of Türkiye has continuously made an extraordinary contribution to building the capacities of the Kosovo Security Force, a contribution for which we are grateful. We will continue to enhance our army's capacities by

cooperating with our allies," emphasized Minister Maqedonci. He added that the development of our army is and will always be aimed at maintaining peace and security, values that we have always cultivated and remained loyal to.



KSF Attended 27th US-Adriatic Charter (A5) Chiefs of Defense Conference

The 27th Conference of the Chiefs of Defense of the US-Adriatic Charter Initiative (A5), comprising Bosnia-Herzegovina, Croatia, Albania, Montenegro, and North Macedonia, has concluded its proceedings. Participants included General Christopher G. Cavoli, the Commander of the US European Command and the American Forces in Europe;



the Commander of the NATO Joint Force Command in Naples, Italy; and the Adjutants General from the respective countries of the US National Guard Partnership Program. Brigadier General Mark Kappelmann represented the Iowa National Guard, while Kosovo and the KSF, on behalf of Commander Lieutenant General Bashkim Jashari, were represented by Deputy Commander Major General Enver Cikaqi. Both generals presented a shared vision for participation in the Adriatic Charter (A5), discussing ongoing cooperation and future plans.



A joint statement was approved during the conference, reaffirming the commitment to stand united against Russia's illegal, unjustifiable, and unprovoked war of aggression against Ukraine. This war has disrupted peace and stability in the Euro-Atlantic area and severely impacted regional and global security. "We condemn, in the strongest terms, Russia's flagrant violation of the United Nations Charter and the effects of Russia's war on the world," the statement read. "We salute the Ukrainian people for their courageous resistance and express our sympathy and condolences for their losses and suffering."

The joint statement emphasized, "We are committed to achieving a just and lasting peace that upholds the principles of the UN Charter, particularly sovereignty, territorial integrity, and independence. Our collective support for Ukraine underscores our mutual understanding that cooperation with allies and partners is vital to our ability to respond to current and future challenges."

Deputy Minister Sylja Hosted the Leader of The American-Jewish Committee, Avital Leibovich



During their meeting, they discussed the general situation in the country and the global security environment, expressing a shared commitment to security and sustainable stability in the region and beyond.

They also highlighted the strong cooperation between the two countries, particularly in defense, with Deputy Minister Sylja emphasizing that this partnership, rooted in a long history of friendship, demonstrates both nations' dedication to peace and security, shared democratic values, and resilience in facing global challenges.

Both parties agreed on the importance of increasing communication and mutual visits among institutional representatives. At the end of the meeting, Mrs. Leibovich thanked Deputy Minister Sylja and the people of Kosovo for their support of the Israeli people in facing current challenges. Deputy Minister Sylja, in turn, thanked her for her many commitments to Kosovo and expressed hope for a swift end to the war and the restoration of peace in the region.

On this anniversary, Minister Maqedonci stated: "Heroes like Sergeant Bunjaku, despite being physically separated from us, remain spiritually and mentally engraved forever in the memory of our people and the history of our homeland, as if carved in stone. Afrim's heroism transcends the momentary, becoming an eternal testament to patriotism and the sacrifices our people have made across generations, even when it meant sacrificing life itself. Such figures never die, and our gratitude for him will live on with our people. Glory to the hero, Afrim Bunjaku!"

20 New Cadets Sworn In at the Center for University Studies – Class of 2028



A military ceremony was held at the "Adem Jashari" barracks in Prishtina to swear in 20 new cadets of the Class of 2028. The group of trainees will return to Ukraine to support their units in eliminating explosive device threats. Deputy Commander of the National Guard of the Kosovo Security Force, Colonel Skender Hoxha, attended the certification ceremony. He congratulated the trainees on

completing the training and spoke about the importance of their training and the noble role of their mission.

Ukrainian Medical Delegation Visited Kosovo Security Force

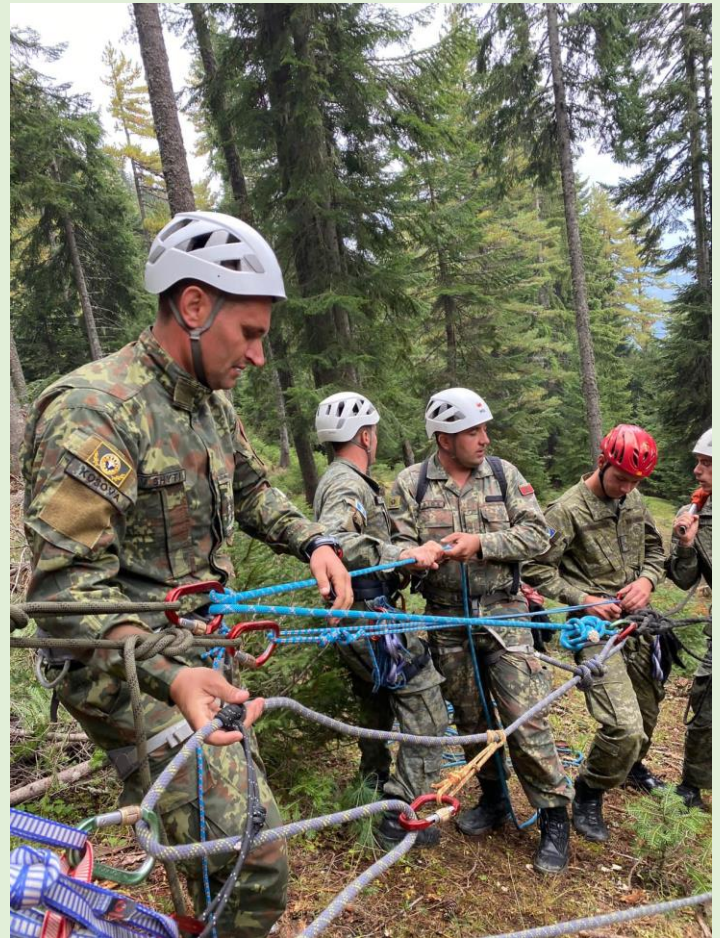
