During the state ceremony for the 25th anniversary of the liberation of the Republic of Kosovo on June 12, a parade featuring units of the Kosovo Security Force and the Kosovo Police was organized in the center of the capital. This event was attended by many citizens.

Kosovo appreciates this sublime sacrifice of the British soldiers, as well as the friendship with the friendly people”, said Minister Maqedonci on this occasion.



MINISTER EJUP MAQEDONCI CELEBRATED 25TH ANNIVERSARY OF CAMP BONDSTEEL

The Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci at the invitation of Colonel Jason Baker, participated in the 25th anniversary of



the establishment of Bondsteel, the first American base in the Republic of Kosovo. On the occasion of this ceremony, he emphasized that the establishment of the Bondsteel camp confirmed our eternal connection with the United States of America, which we commit ourselves to always deepen.

Also, the Chief of Staff of the Kosovo Security Force, Brigadier General Ilir Qeriqi, took part in this ceremony. Camp Bondsteel is one of the largest US military bases in Europe, built in 1999 after NATO's intervention in Kosovo, which has played an important role in stabilizing the region and is also a symbol of commitment of the US for peace and security in the Balkans.

MAJOR GENERAL STEPHEN OSBORN'S KOSOVO VISIT STRENGTHENS BILATERAL COOPERATION

The Minister of Defense, Ejup Maqedonci together with the Minister of Defense of Lithuania, Laurynas Kasčiūnas, in Brussels have signed the joint agreement, according to which Kosovo is officially part of the Demining Coalition for Ukraine.

With this, Kosovo has become the 17th member state of this coalition, which aims to provide support to Ukraine, through the provision of training in the field of demining, a commitment given as part of the Contact Group for Ukraine.

Minister Maqedonci emphasized that Kosovo took an important step in its representation and role in global security, and that this is another step taken by Kosovo for the Ukrainian people, as two military support packages have been delivered so far.

In this exercise, the KSF contingent was presented with high professional training, where during the implementation the participants acted as part of a Combined Joint Task Force (CJTF), where the main objective of the exercise was the exchange of military experience, the improvement of interaction and understanding between partner countries and participating agencies in this exercise.

Our soldiers managed to successfully achieve the objectives in which the most complicated operations with the air force are foreseen, in cooperation with the Turkish commando forces.

Among the 50 state delegations that took part in this exercise, our country was also represented by the first deputy minister of the Ministry of Defense, Shemsi Sylja, the commander of the LFC, Brigadier General Hysen Dreshaj, the military attaché in

Türkiye, Colonel Bekim Zejnullahu and the delegation from the Ministry of Defense and the KSF.

This exercise is considered as the largest and most comprehensive exercise, from land, air and sea, carried out day and night, with the participation of 45 countries of the world, with over 12 thousand troops and using the most modern and advanced weaponry of the latest sophisticated technology of Türkiye's defense industry.

In this official visit, the delegation led by Deputy Minister Sylja also visited the fair where the highest achievements of the armament technology of Turkish companies, which are the basis of the defense industry, were exhibited.

holds a special place, much like that of other martyrs.

During those challenging days, we shared not only difficult moments but also pleasant memories from that period," said Minister Maqedonci.

DTRA PERFORMS AN INTER-INSTITUTIONAL EXERCISE

The Defense Threat Reduction Agency (DTRA) from the United States of America has organized the interagency field exercise against Weapons of Mass Destruction (CBRN). This organized event comes after the ten-year commitment of DTRA, in raising the capacities for protection from Weapons of Mass Destruction for the institutions of Kosovo.

During the implementation of the field exercise, the acquired skills of the HAZMATC Hazardous Materials Company of the KSF, in cooperation with other emergency response entities in Kosovo, are demonstrated, with the aim of responding to chemical, biological, radiological and nuclear (CBRN) materials.

The audience in this training were the subjects of the

Government of the Republic of Kosovo with CBRN response capacities and capabilities at the tactical level, including HAZMAT-KSF, Kosovo Police, Prishtina Fire Brigade and the Border Police Unit.

The execution of the exercise was monitored by DTRA instructors as well as members of the 71st Civil Support Team from the Iowa National Guard. Present at the ceremony were deputy Minister of Defense Mr. Shemsi Sylja, deputy commander of the KSF, major general Enver Cikaqi, commander of the National Guard, brigadier general Naim Haziri, dep. KSF SUCCESSFULLY CONDUCTED THE “SIGNAL 2024” COMMUNICATION CAPACITY TESTING EXERCISE



In the framework of operational readiness testing, by order of the Commander of the Kosovo Security Force, the “Signal 2024” field exercise was conducted, which aimed to test communication in the KSF, at three levels, Strategic, Operational and Tactical.

The exercise took place in the territory of the Republic of Kosovo, where the KSF communication units, led by the Department of Communication and Information Technology of the General Staff of the Kosovo Security Force, were deployed in the field, in different

locations and test communication capacity by providing services with combat radio network, administrative support radio network, intranet, internet and interoperability of communication systems and networks.

The Chief of Staff of the General Staff, Brigadier General Ilir Qeriqi and an associate visited the Communication Center deployed on the ground, from where they were closely informed about the progress and flow of the “Signal 2024” exercise. The head of G6 at the General Staff, Colonel Fidaim Elshani presented to General Qeriq the capacity and readiness of communication, directly demonstrating the support with communication in several areas of the operation at the same time, with the aim of providing command and control for the troops engaged in operations.

The exercise is concluded with the analysis after the action, the return of the forces to the bases.

JOINT OPERATION REMOVES WWII BOMBS IN KOSOVO



In a collaborative effort, the demining teams from the National Guard of the Kosovo Security Force and the EOD team from the Bondsteel camp of the US Army successfully removed three German SC-50 bombs, remnants from World War II. These bombs were discovered during construction work on the Pristina-Podujevo highway in the village of Shakovicë. They have been relocated to a secure area for later demolition, following the demining teams’ protocols.

COMBAT ENGINEERS READY FOR THE MISSION

In the premises of the Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC) in the “Skënderbeu” barracks in Ferizaj, the certification ceremony for the “Basic Course for Combat Engineers” was held.

During this training, the trainees were trained in setting up combat and defensive positions, in the construction of boats and improvised bridges for crossing water obstacles, in the placement of obstacles, in the selection and fortification of objects for combat, as well as in the use of explosives for breaching obstacles in accomplishing the mission.

In the framework of bilateral cooperation with our strategic partner, the United States of America, a mobile team from the Security Assistance Training Management Organization (SATMO) of the American army has carried out mortar training for KSF members, the theoretical part has been carried out in the Training and Doctrine Command in Ferizaj, while the practical part is in the training ground in Melle of the Republic of Albania. The purpose of the training was to increase artillery capacities, advance operation with weapon systems, raise tactical skills, increase accuracy in shooting targets, with the aim of professional development of KSF members.

The completion of the studies culminated in the “Joint Resolve - Warsaw 2024” exercise, which applied the knowledge gained during the training, focusing strongly on Allied Joint Operations in the entire spectrum of operations.



FIELD EXERCISE “STEEL WOLF” IS COMPLETED SUCCESSFULLY

The Second Regiment of the Land Forces Command has carried out the “Steel Wolf” field exercise where two companies of the regiment have been validated as part of the exercise.

Company Validation is a process that aims to ensure that military units are prepared, capable and equipped to fulfill their operational tasks.

This Mission includes a series of actions and procedures that evaluate and certify the readiness and ability of the military unit to carry out the operations with the assigned mission in order to be prepared for the next phases of training and validation of the Regiment in training.

The objectives of FE “Steel Wolf” were to increase the capacities and tactical and physical performance at the level of the Companies, to test the capacities of the companies and to validate them in order to fulfill the final goal of validating the regiment and increasing the combat capacities for the defense of the territory.
